## NOTE:

You don't have to do ALL of the following steps.

Many days, I just grab my talking points, get my light, camera 'n' mic going and then go *live*.

That's the magic of video...

YOU get to decide what level video you want to make!

#### And now without further ado...

### **Your Filming Checklist!**

#### **BEFORE THE FILMING DAY:**

- 1. Create your script or talking points
- 2. Depending on the complexity of your video, brainstorm concept ideas
- 3. Test out your wardrobe to see what looks good on camera (see this tutorial)
- 4. Test out your hair + makeup to see how it looks on camera
- 5. Decide on where you're going to film and see how it looks on camera... **yep, there's a trend here!)**
- Test out your lights, camera and microphone to make sure everything is working okay
- 7. Make sure your camera + batteries are charged
- 8. Decide on your call to action
- 9. Set your lights and camera where you'll be filming (and leave it up if you can)

#### **ON THE FILMING DAY:**

- 1. Set up your lights, camera and mic if you couldn't keep them up from the previous day
- 2. Plug in equipment
- 3. Go through your talking points / script
- 4. Play some music that helps get you in the *emotional* mood throughout the process
- 5. Get dressed
- 6. Do your hair + makeup
- 7. Warm up get yourself in the right *physical* space for the shoot
- 8. Get a glass of water and place it near where you'll be filming (a place that's in arm's reach and not near equipment a side table if you've got one)
- 9. Film a quick test to make sure everything's still working
- 10. Put household phones on silent
- 11. Request quiet from the household (if necessary)
- 12. Launch any necessary filming programs/platforms
- 13. Make sure you'll be posting to the right space (especially for live streams)
- 14. Close your eyes and set a positive intention for how you're about to uplift someone
- 15. Open your eyes, press that "record" button or go live
- 16. Have fun, be flexible and engage your peeps!
